As the nation's combat logistics support agency, the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) manages the global supply chain – from raw materials to end user to disposition, for the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Coast Guard, 11 combatant commands, other federal agencies and partner and allied nations.

DLA Quick Facts:

- DLA provides more than \$42 billion in goods and services annually
- Supports more than 2,400 weapon systems
- Manages nine supply chains and about 5 million items
- Operates in most states and 28 countries
- Supports disaster response and humanitarian relief efforts at home and abroad
- DLA acquires items from manufacturers and suppliers and provides them to DoD and other federal and regional customers, often with supplementary services such as warehousing, packaging and transportation
- DLA contracts for items that are provided directly by the manufacturer to DLA customers
